Reconfirmation Meeting for December

Reconfirm instructional delivery method:

DK - 12 Hybrid and Virtual Academy

Reconfirm how instruction will be delivered for each grade level:

Elementary (DK - 1st Grade):

Students will have the option to attend school 4 days per week for face-to-face instruction with the other day's instruction occurring virtually (Hybrid Model) OR attend the virtual academy.

For in-person instruction, students and staff health and safety will be addressed through a cohort model that keeps students together for the entire day.

Starting November 16, all students were offered only distance learning due to a very high COVID-19 threat level. All students were provided an internet-ready device and we have assured that all families have access to the internet. Students are provided daily virtual meeting lessons in addition to online and physical "packet" materials to support their continued learning.

This continues through the end of December 2020.

Elementary (Grades 2nd - 5th):

Students will have the option to attend school 2 days per week for face-to-face instruction with the other days' instruction occurring virtually (Hybrid Model) OR attend the virtual academy.

For in-person instruction, students and staff health and safety will be addressed through a cohort model that keeps students together for the entire day.

Starting November 16, all students were offered only distance learning due to a very high COVID-19 threat level. All students were provided an internet-ready device and we have assured that all families have access to the internet. Students are provided daily virtual meeting lessons in addition to online and physical “packet” materials to support their continued learning.

This continues through the end of December 2020.

Middle School (Grades 6th - 8th):

Students will have the option to attend school alternating between 2 & 3 days per week for face-to-face instruction with the other day’s instruction occurring virtually (Hybrid Model) OR attend the virtual academy.

For in-person instruction, students and staff health and safety will be addressed through a cohort model that keeps students together for the entire day. In the Cohort Model, students will learn through a variety of methods utilizing digital content and instruction.

Starting November 16, all students were offered only distance learning due to a very high COVID-19 threat level. All students were provided an internet-ready device and we have assured that all families have access to the internet. Students are provided daily virtual meeting lessons in addition to online and physical “packet” materials to support their continued learning.

This continues through the end of December 2020.

High School (Grades 9th - 12th):

Students will have the option to attend school alternating between 2 & 3 days per week for face-to-face instruction with the other days’ instruction occurring virtually (Hybrid Model) OR attend the virtual academy. Beginning on Oct 24,

For in-person instruction, students and staff health and safety will be addressed through a cohort model that keeps students together for the entire day with minimal exceptions. In the Cohort Model, students will learn through a variety of methods utilizing digital content and instruction.

Starting November 16, all students were offered only distance learning due to a very high COVID-19 threat level. All students were provided an internet-ready device and we have assured that all families have access to the internet. Students are provided daily virtual meeting lessons in addition to online and physical “packet” materials to support their continued learning.

This continues through the end of December 2020.

Reconfirm whether or not the district is offering higher levels of in-person instruction for English language learners, special education students, or other special populations:

The District is offering the same levels of in-person instruction for students considered special populations as those receiving general education in-person instruction.

Starting November 16, many students considered “at risk” or having a disability would have some opportunities for in-person tutoring and other in-person support, limiting the total number of students in any single room to three.

This continues through the end of December 2020.
